

Colonel Jimmy E. Hall assumed the position of JROTC Program Coordinator and Senior Army Instructor (SAI) at Monarch High School on October 20, 2014.

Colonel Hall began his military career with the U.S. Army Reserve on December 1, 1980. He was assigned to the 479th Ordnance Company in Clarksdale, Mississippi as an Ammunition Specialist (55B). Colonel Hall held the rank of Specialist prior to his commission at Mississippi Valley State University as a Second Lieutenant in the Adjutant General Corps in 1985 where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice. He is a graduate of the Adjutant General Basic and Advanced Courses, the Combined Arms and Services Staff School, the

Command and Staff General College, Nuclear, Biological and Chemical School, Career Management Officers, Human Resource Management, Army Reserve Personnel Managers, Third Recruiting Brigade Marketing and Missioning, Recruiting Operations and Recruiting Officer Commanders' Courses. He holds a Master of Business Administration from Columbia Southern University.

Colonel Hall has served in a wide array of Army Reserve assignments to include Company Command, Battalion and Brigade Adjutant.
